The Paradigms, Posture, and Practices of Jesus

What time is it?

If I could save time in a bottle...for many of us just that opening lyric can start Jim Croce's song 'Time in a Bottle' playing in our heads!

If I could save time in a bottle The first thing that I'd like to do Is to save every day 'Til eternity passes away Just to spend them with you

followed by the haunting and telling chorus

But there never seems to be enough time To do the things you want to do Once you find them



And isn't that the story we read on the faces of men and women everyday?

Everyone is busy - pressed and trying to find 'time'. The opening line of a conversation I have heard countless times '*I know you are busy*', why is that? It seems there is an assumption that time is pressing, rushing, demanding, and seldom, if ever, able to deliver what it promised. I asked the medical assistant taking my vitals at the doctor's office 'what is time for you?'. Her response was honest and yet caused spurred reflection when she said, 'when I can look and see the number of things that I have accomplished in a day' - fascinating. She did not seem threatened by my inquiry but reflective in noticing that she equated time with efficiency and productivity or, dare I add, profitability. As I acknowledged her answer I said 'interesting how often we define time by things that may or may not give us life.' Production does not mean life. In fact, when we experience sickness - the very first order of business is to 'cease' activity and rest in order to restore life and well being! This is something we see every spring when those bulbs that have already begun to make their way out of the ground after an extended time of rest are not measured by quantity but in beauty! Beloved, in a world tipping on the edge of insanity from our frenetic lifestyles maybe we need to rethink how we look at time!

Hours and minutes are not the source of life - the scripture declares plainly, in repentance and rest is your salvation; maybe we have been eating from the wrong tree.

But there never seems to be enough time...and isn't that your experience? If I just had enough time...yet it always seems to outdistance and outpace us - again - and that old familiar feeling of lack comes to haunt the soul, and with it a voice speaking in the shadows; '*if/when* you eat from this tree then it will all be better', *if/when* promising a 'secure' settled life, '*If/when* you just reach and take it for yourself you will be secure, significant, and you will belong'. That beloved is the tree of the knowledge of good and evil - the hamster wheel that always keeps us busy but never gives life. Its the wrong tree.

Mark records Jesus' first words as this '*The time is fulfilled...*' (Mark 1:15). Jesus' first words are not about a date on the chronological calendar past or present but a shift in **time** '*...the Kingdom of God is at hand...*', or as one person translates this '*the Kingdom is close enough to reach*'. Jesus who said if I be lifted up (a reference to the cross) I will draw all men to myself. Because '*I am the way the truth and the Life*.' And later John hears these words in heaven - '*if anyone is thirsty or hungry let him come to me*.' Beloved there was another tree in the garden and Jesus restored us to that tree - it is close enough to reach - **the Tree of Life**.

One famous statement first written by a poet in 1853 put some words to this reality We live in deeds, not years; in thoughts, not breaths; In feelings, not in figures on a dial. We should count time by heart-throbs. He most lives Who thinks most—feels the noblest—acts the best.

Here is what all this means as we think about the spring of this election year.

What time is it?

• It's always the right time to lay down our frenetic, chronological frenetic demand to push harder so we can hear Jesus' invitation- 'are you tired, worn out, burned out...come to Me for I am meek and gentle of heart' Matthew 11:28. Its always a good time to come in surrender to Jesus.

Who gets to tell the time?

• This is a question the church fathers attempted to address when they chose to layout a different calendar for the church. A calendar that begins with Advent and leads toward Lent - a calendar shaped around the central hope of our confession and our source of life - Jesus. A calendar not shaped around my *if/when* resolutions but surrendered to the profound revolution of a Kingdom centered in love. A Kingdom capable of re-founding the world and transforming lives not by power or punishment, but by self giving, self emptying love and forgiveness secured on a tree that gave and gives life! Beloved, this is the One who gets to tell time - the author of time.

So what do we do with Lent? Especially in the time that we are living?

• I am not suggesting we dust off old 'religious' practices (what are you 'giving up' for lent?) - but rather to pause and allow this Lent to give you a pause to hear the words of Jesus afresh, today - 'the time is fulfilled, the Kingdom of God is at hand, repent and believe....' for today, this moment, this year for ALL that my life holds.

What time is it? May this Lent be a time of fresh surrender to eat from the right tree? The tree of life!
